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ORDINANCE NO. 44

Master in Chemicals, Sales and Marketing Management

The course for the Masters Degree will be divided in four semesters covering two academic sessions. The first academic session will comprise first and second semester while second academic session, the third and fourth semesters. Each semester shall normally comprise 90 (ninety) working days.

Eligibility :

- (a) M.Sc. in Chemistry/Biochemistry/Microbiology/
Botany/Zoology
- (b) B.Sc. with Chemistry/Biochemistry, B.Pharma,
B.Sc.(Ag).

Minimum percentage required is 50% of Jiwaji University or any other University/Deemed University/Institute recognised by the University.

Admission to the course will be given to the candidates strictly on merit. The merit will be prepared after an aptitude test followed by group discussion and personal interview. The details will be finalised by the department, approval of Vice-Chancellor be taken and published every year in the prospectus.

Candidates who have done diploma in Chemicals, Sales and Marketing Management are eligible for admission in IIIrd semester of Masters Course provided seats are available. Admission will be given on the basis of merit. Those who will join IIIrd semester of the Masters course will not be awarded with diploma.

- (c) English is the only medium of instruction and examination for this course.

In order to organise extra-curricular activities, the students of the course will have a chemical society.

The department will have a placement cell.

The department will have an Alumni Association in order to have interaction with those who have graduated from this department.

Examination fee, admission fee and other fee will be in accordance with the decision of the department/university for the said course from time to time.

A student of this programme will not be permitted to take up any other course simultaneously. However, restriction shall not be applicable to the students of language, certificate course, computer classes or remedial classes.

Scheme of Examination :

The examination of first and third semester shall consist of six (06) theory papers of 100 marks each of which 70 marks shall be for university examination and 30 marks for internal assessment. Two tests of 15 marks each and one make up test for each course shall be held on the dates specified by the Head/Coordinator of the department/School of Studies. The marks of the tests will be counted as the award for internal assessment. Tutorials and surveys can also be included for the internal assessment.

The second and fourth semester will consist in four (04) theory papers of 100 marks each of which 70 marks shall be for University examination and 30 marks for internal assessment.

Second and fourth semester will consist industrial training of four weeks in each semester. The candidate will

submit a project report followed by evaluation and viva. The total marks for this is 200. Out of 200, the training and report will comprise 150 marks and viva 50 marks. An external examiner will be called to evaluate and to conduct the viva. For 4-5 candidates one management expert from University/Institute/Industry can be invited.

c) A candidate failing in to a maximum of any two course/paper of first semester examination shall be allowed to continue in the second semester. In the second semester the candidate have to appear in these papers of first first semester (in which he/she has failed in first semester).

The candidate who have cleared all the papers of first semester but have failed in any two papers of second semester shall be promoted to third semester.

The candidates who have passed all the papers of first and second semesters but have failed in two papers of third semester will be promoted to fourth semester.

The candidates who have cleared the first three semesters but failed in two papers of fourth semester can appear in these papers (in which he/she has failed) as an ex-student in the next semester.

If a candidate fails in more than two papers he/she will be allowed to appear as an ex-student in the whole examination of that semester in which he/she thus failed. Such candidates (if passed in that examinations) will be entitled for admission as a regular student in the next semester, if any.

For such additional attempts the university shall charge additional examination fee as notified by the university time to time.

No candidate shall be allowed more than two attempts (including the original attempt) in a particular semester. If that candidate does not succeed in two attempts too, he/she will not be allowed to continue and will be declared fail.

The result of the first, second and third semesters shall be declared as pass/fail. The final result for Masters degree will be declared after the fourth semester. The sum total of all the marks secured by the students will be counted and division shall be awarded on the basis of marks secured as follows :

First division	:	60% or above marks in aggregate
Second division	:	Less than 60% but 48% or more in aggregate
Third division	:	Less than 48% but 40% or more in aggregate.
