

ORDINANCE NO. 64

Master of Science Nursing (M.Sc. Nursing)  
[Section ACC. 37(11) and 39(1)]

GENERAL RULES :

- (1) The degree shall be conferred after the acceptance of a thesis and qualifying the Written, Oral, Practical and Clinical Examination.
- (2) The first examination shall be conducted as a Part-I. At the end of the first year of regular study. If candidates fails in three subjects he will be entitled to appear in supplementary exam and alongwith final year exam. His result of Part-II will not be declared if he is not completing all the paper of the Ist Year.

ELIGIBILITY :

- (a) Qualification : A candidate for the above degree must be either B.Sc. Nursing of any of the University recognised all equivalent too and Indian Nursing Council of the India.
- (b) Experience :
  - (i) The candidate should be registered with the State Registration Council of Nursing & Midwifery.
  - (ii) The candidate should two year of experience in a teaching hospital or in a College or in a School of Nursing or a Community Health Programme. Out of these two years the minimum of six months should have been in a field of speciality.
- (c) Medical Fitness : The candidate before the admission shall be examined by a Medical Officer authorised by the Principal for the purpose.

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The admission shall be granted only when the candidate is found to medically fit to undergo the academic course and does not suffer from any disability or contagious disease.

(4) CRITERIA FOR THE SELECTION OF THE CANDIDATE :

The candidates for the admission to be M.Sc. (Nursing) course shall have to appear in a written examination ordinarily held in the month of July every year followed by a personal interview as per the merit of written examination and performance at the interview.

(5) The Candidates selected for the admission on the basis of the written test and interview shall have to apply for registration to the Registrar, Jiwaji University along with the prescribed fee and eligibility certificate wherever applicable. Provided that foreign candidate admitted to the course shall be subject to the provision of ordinance 39 of this University.

(6) A candidate after obtaining a degree of Bachelor of Science (Nsg.) of this University or any other University or any other recognised degree equivalent after complete regular course of study of one academic year in a school of studies or any affiliated College/Institutions shall be admitted to Part-I of the Master of Science (Nsg.) examination.

(7) A candidate after passing the Part-I examination of M.Sc. (Nsg.) and completing the regular course of study for one year in a school of study for a College/Institution affiliated to this University shall be admitted to M.Sc. (Nsg.) Part-II examination. Provided that the candidate who shall fail in three papers shall be allowed to appear in that paper of Part-I along with the regular papers of Part-II.

(8) The general conditions pertaining to the attendance, assessment and modalities of internal evaluation of practicals, shall be as per provision laid down in ordinance No. 6 of this University. Provided that the divisions and qualifying marks in each paper shall be as follows :

- (a) The qualifying marks of each papers 50% aggregate.
- (b) And first class with 60% in aggregate.

(9) In addition to the Internal assessments, practical, theory examination the candidate shall be required to submit a dissertation in the field of speciality at least two months before the date of final examination of M.Sc. (Nsg.) part-II. The dissertation to be evaluated by any internal and an external examiners and viva voce examination shall be arranged ordinarily two weeks prior to the University examination. The candidates whose dissertation is not accepted shall not be allowed to appear the Part-II examination of M.Sc. (N). They shall however be provided an other chance to resubmit the dissertation after modifying it as per suggestions of the board of examiners and it being approved the candidate shall be allowed to be appear at the next Part-II examination of M.Sc. (N). The medium of Instruction shall be English.

(10) The syllabus for the course and speciality shall be prescribed by the Board of Studies.
